Minutes - October 5, 2006

Tenth Session

COUNCILLOR'S ISSUES

Huron East Resolution Re: Condition of Provincial Highways in Huron County - Specifically Highway No. 8 Between Seaforth and Mitchell.

Councillor B. MacLellan presented the attached resolution (Appendix "A").

Councillor MacLellan addressed Council asking to have a written letter of support of Huron East's request to have the Ministry of Transportation repair Highway 8 between Seaforth and Mitchell. He also suggested that Clinton and Goderich should consider writing a letter in support.

Councillor B. Dowson spoke to Council regarding adding Highway #21 to this resolution. Councillor MacLellan responded that you do not want to ask for too much and maybe to give more merit, do two separate letters. Councillor Connelly agreed with the condition of Highway #8. Councillor Bezaire suggested that the MTO be contacted to see if the repairs are included in their five year plan, and do this before the letter is sent.

Councillor B. Dowson announced that he will have competition for the Bluewater Mayorship - Janice Snider was in the audience today.

Councillor D. Layton informed Council of a News Report regarding property in central Palmerston which was former railway land. There are soil contaminants present which may pose a hazard to public health and safety. The Town has received several engineering reports which have identified the areas of greatest concern.

The Ministry of Environment has reviewed these reports and has issued an Order which outlines the steps necessary to ensure public safety. The Order requires the contaminated soil to be either removed or covered to a sufficient depth to prevent contact by people and animals. The preliminary cost estimates to deal with this problem are very high. It seems that any viable course of action will incur costs upwards of three million dollars. Council and staff are consulting with other levels of government in order to produce a viable long-range plan for the community of Palmerston.

Councillor B. Van Diepenbeek asked for an update on the Tiger Dunlop's Tomb. Beth Ross, Director of Cultural Services, answered that the work will be done this Fall. RFP's were sent to seven prequalified stone masons, two bids were received and the successful bid was awarded to Gilholm Stoneworks Ltd, London. Councillor Van Diepenbeek inquired about the error on the date on the tombstone. Ms. Ross indicated that there were no plans to change the tombstone by the County at this time.

Councillor R. Rognvaldson spoke regarding the opening of the Howick Community Centre and thanks the Councillors and staff that attended for their support.

Warden R. Morley announced that the Warden's Reports for Fall 2006 are on the Councillor's desks today to be delivered to their Municipal Offices. The balance of the Reports will be distributed in the Weekend Flyer Bags on October 6, 2006.

Councillor MacLellan is not in favour of spending any County dollars on this bridge. Councillor Shewfelt and Councillor Van Diepenbeek believe that Council needs to make a recommendation now. Councillor Dykstra would like to know what will the costs be to have this bridge kept to a 2 tonne limit.
