3. Consents

This consent was approved by the committee at the May 14, 2008 meeting. The last date for filing an appeal is June 11, 2008.

The Municipality of Bluewater Council at their meeting held June 9, 2008 passed a motion indicating their intention to appeal the committee's decision to the Ontario Municipal Board (OMB). The appeal was received on June 11, 2008. Bluewater had previously recommended denial of the consent due to the Minimum Distance Separation deficiencies. The committee may wish to obtain legal representation for the OMB hearing.

4. Delegated Consents

The authority to grant undisputed consents is delegated to the Director of Planning and Development under By-law No. 3, 2006. The following applications have been approved since the last report, for the information of County Council.

- a) B68/07 Timothy & James Horst
Lot 15 & 16, South of Adelaide Street and Lots 15 & 16, North of Mary Street
Plan 243 (Fordwich) Township of Howick

This undisputed consent was granted provisional consent on April 10, 2008, subject to conditions. The purpose and effect of this application was for the creation of a new lot. The vacant lands to be severed from Pt lot 15 & 16, South of Adelaide Street, Plan 243 is approximately 0.79 ac (0.3 ha) in size and the vacant lands to be retained 1.50 ac (0.6 ha) in size.

- b) B69/07 Timothy & James Horst
Lot 15 & 16, South of Adelaide Street, and Lots 15 & 16, North of Mary Street
Plan 243 (Fordwich), Township of Howick

This undisputed consent was granted provisional consent on April 10, 2008, subject to conditions. The purpose and effect of this application was for the creation of a new lot. The vacant lands to be severed from Pt Lot 15 & 16, South of Adelaide Street and Pt Lot 15 & 16, North of Mary Street, Plan 243 is approximately 0.5 ac (0.2 ha) and the vacant lands to be retained abutting the severed lands to the east is 0.5 ac (0.2 ha) and abutting the severed lands to the west is 0.5 ac (0.2 ha) in size.

- c) B9/08 Dave Gardiner Farms Inc. (owner)
Ron Soudant & Shauna Gardiner-Soudant (applicants)
Pt Lot 19, 20 & 21, NTR Concession, Usborne Ward, Municipality of South Huron

This undisputed consent was granted provisional consent on April 30, 2008, subject to conditions. The purpose and effect of this application was for an addition to a lot. The application was revised after discussions with the applicant/owner and Planning Department to reduce the area that was proposed to be removed from agricultural production from 3 acres to 1.4 ac. The proposed severance will add 1.4 ac (0.57 ha) of vacant lands to an existing lot owned by the applicants approximately 1.27 ac (0.5 ac) in size to build a new home for a total of 2.7 ac (1.1 ha). The lands to be retained will be approximately 164 ac (66.7 ha) with existing structures and outbuildings.

- d) B12/08 Alvin Campbell
Pt Lot 25, Concession 2, Stephen Ward, Municipality of South Huron

This undisputed consent was granted provisional consent on April 30, 2008, subject to conditions. The purpose and effect of this application is for the addition to a lot to enlarge a 0.95 ac property abutting to east. The vacant lands to be severed is approximately 3.3 ac (1.3 ha) and the lands to be retained is approximately 4.0 ac (1.6 ha) which contains an existing house and shed.

- e) B19/08 Paul & Joan Spittal (owners) Wynja Farms Inc. (applicant)
Pt Lots 12 & 13, Concession 3, HRS, Tuckersmith Ward, Municipality of Huron East

This undisputed consent was granted provisional consent on May 9, 2008, subject to conditions. The purpose and effect of this application is for the creation of a new lot under surplus farm dwelling

policies. The lands to be severed is approximately 4.2 ac (1.8 ha) with an existing house, barn and shed. The vacant lands to be retained is approximately 82.2 ac (33.3 ha).

- f) B20/08 Kenneth & Linda Baillie (owners) and Kenneth Dalton (applicant)
Pt Lot 31, Concession 15, Grey Ward, Municipality of Huron East

This undisputed consent was granted provisional consent on May 9, 2008, subject to conditions. The purpose and effect of this application is for the creation of a new lot under the surplus severance policies. The lands to be severed contains an existing house & shed approximately 2 ac (0.8 ha) and the vacant lands to be retained is approximately 98 ac (39.2 ha) in size.

5. Official Plans and Amendments

- a) Official Plan Amendment No. 4 - Municipality of Huron East

The proposed Official Plan Amendment (OPA No. 4) is a text amendment that affects lands designated Highway Commercial in the Wards of Brussels and Seaforth, Municipality of Huron East.

Currently, the Highway Commercial policies permit a residence above or behind the main commercial use/building. The proposed change would allow a detached accessory residence on the same lot as the commercial use where it is not feasible to attach the residential use above or behind the main commercial use/building. The accessory residence must remain part of the highway commercial holding. This OPA would allow zoning by-law amendments to be considered on specified lands zoned 'C3 (Highway Commercial)' and 'C6 (Fringe Highway Commercial)' in the Seaforth and Brussels Wards.

The public meeting was held on May 20, 2008. The Huron East Council adopted OPA No. 4 on May 20, 2008. The planning report is attached (Appendix A).

It is recommended that Amendment No. 4 to the Municipality of Huron East Official Plan be approved and that notice of decision be circulated.

- b) Official Plan Amendment No. 2 – Municipality of Bluewater
Minimum Distance Separation (MDS) 1 Formulae for Surplus Dwelling Severance and Lots of Record in Lands Designated as Agricultural

This Official Plan Amendment has been initiated by the Municipality of Bluewater. Official Plan Amendment No. 2 amends how the Minimum Distance Separation formulae is applied to the creation of surplus dwelling severances and building on existing lots (lots of record) designated agriculture in the Bluewater Official Plan. OPA No. 2 proposes to amend the surplus dwelling severance policies of the Bluewater Official Plan to remove the requirement that the severed lot must comply with the MDS I – "Type B" land use (double MDS distance) and permit severances to be created where they comply with the MDS I – "Type A" land use (single MDS distance). This

amendment will also permit a residence to be built on an existing lot (lot of record) where it complies with MDS I formulae – “Type A” land use. The planning report is attached (Appendix B).

It is recommended that Amendment No. 2 to the Municipality of Bluewater Official Plan be approved and the notice of decision be circulated.

** c) New Official Plan – Town of Goderich

Goderich Council passed its new Official Plan on June 9, 2008. County Council is the approval authority for local Official Plans.

The Official Plan applies to all lands in the Town of Goderich and is a statement of where and how development should take place within the municipality. The Official Plan contains public value statements, goals and policies for land use and related matters. This plan replaces the existing 1981 Official Plan for the Town of Goderich. Subject to the proposed modification, this Official Plan is consistent with the Provincial Policy Statement under the Planning Act and conforms with the County of Huron Official Plan. A planning report is attached (Appendix C). The complete Official Plan is enclosed under separate cover.

It is recommended that the Town of Goderich Official Plan be modified and approved, and that the notice of decision be circulated, with the following modification: to redesignate 199 Anglesea Street from Residential to Industrial.

After discussion the committee felt the lands associated with 199 Anglesea Street could remain designated as Residential in the Official Plan as proposed by Goderich Council and that the issues identified in the planning report would be addressed by the Town of Goderich prior to development (i.e. compatibility with the neighbouring industrial use and railway including Ministry of Environment requirements; potential soil contamination and environmental condition of the site).

6. Workload Strategy for County Official Plan Review / Sustainability Planning

Planning staff are experiencing a heavy workload, owing in part to the volume and complexity of development applications, new comprehensive zoning by-laws, the County Official Plan Review / Sustainability Planning, and expanded economic development efforts. The attached report (Appendix D) provides a workload strategy of giving priority to the County Official Plan Review / Sustainability Planning, while also advancing the new comprehensive zoning by-laws for local municipalities. The report was circulated to local municipalities on May 14, 2008 requesting any comments by June 6, 2008.

8. Subdivisions

Plan of Subdivision 40T08002, Bradley Oke, Zurich Ward, Municipality of Bluewater

Plan of Subdivision File 40T08002 applies to part of Huron Vacant Land Condominium Plan No. 2 and Huron Standard Condominium No. 6 formerly part of Park Lots A, D, E, F, & G, Registered Plan 323, Zurich Ward, Municipality of Bluewater. The total area of the proposed development is 6.9 hectares with access onto Kippen Road.

The vacant land condominium was created in July 2006 and is proposed to be converted to a plan of subdivision. The proposed plan of subdivision contains 8 lots for single detached residences. The proposed lot lines for the 8 lots match the unit lines for the existing plan of condominium. The existing internal private street (part of which is in the vacant land condominium and part of which is in the standard condominium) is proposed to be assumed by the Municipality for access to the lots. The development is serviced by Municipal sewer and water.

It is recommended that the Plan of Subdivision File 40T 08002 be granted draft approval with the attached conditions and that the notice of draft plan approval be circulated.

9. Community Economic Development Activity

a) Huron and Perth's Shakespeare to the Shoreline Project – grant update

Ontario is supporting tourism in Huron and Perth by investing \$10,000 to help market Shakespeare to the Shoreline project.

The \$10,000 grant will be used to promote themed, self-guided driving tours. Tours are structured around the corridor's strengths. 110 different experiences include: Antiques and Collectibles, Artisans and Art galleries, Farm Markets, Gardens and Gardeners' Dreams, Live Theatre and Performances, Historic Shops and Attractions and Nature Walks. The project, which is in its third year, promotes tourism in Huron and Perth Counties.

Project participants and supporters consist of the Strategic Committee: Stratford Tourism Alliance, Perth County Visitors Association, Tourism Goderich, Huron Tourism Association, County of Huron, and Tourism St. Mary's. Contributing partners include 34 industry suppliers (accommodations and restaurants) and other Perth and Huron County municipalities.

The Ministry of Tourism's Industry Partners Proposal Program works with groups in the tourism industry to develop and implement innovative and co-operative marketing projects. This project will contribute to developing Ontario as a four-season destination, increasing visitor stay and boosting the local economy through increased tourism spending.

b) 2007 Annual Tourism Report and 2008 Tourism Strategy

The 2007 Tourism Report and the 2008 Tourism Strategy was distributed to committee. The report details the 2007 activity and the 2008 strategy for the following aspects of the County's role in tourism:

- Partnership with the Huron Tourism Association
- Huron County Tourism Event and Brochure Swap
- Marketing programs and partnerships
- Travel writers
- Departmental Resources for Tourism

c) Huron Community Matters Conference

A third annual conference was held May 28 and 29, 2008 in Brussels to celebrate the community economic development success stories in Huron County with 80 people attending in total. Robin Cardozo, CEO Ontario Trillium Foundation, was the keynote speaker at Wednesday's opening

dinner. Success stories on Thursday included the Falls Reserve Challenge Course (a project of Huron Economic Development Matters), rural broadband and GIS, and Foundations (supports young people with disabilities). Workshops included Huron Climatic Study for Vineyards, Buy Local Buy Fresh, Payment for Ecological Goods & Services (field tour), Sustainable Huron, Volunteer Portal, Huron Economic Development Matters, Downtown Revitalization, and Cultural Plan. The conference is hosted by Huron Community Matters, a collaborative effort of Huron Business Development Corporation, Huron County (Cultural Services, Health Unit, Planning and Development, Social Services) and the Huron United Way.

14. Report of the Acting Director of Public Works

Dave Laurie, Acting Director of Public Works, and Mike Alcock, Civil Engineering Technologist, presented the following reports for the information of committee and Council.

- a) Highways Information Report (Appendix F)

Discussion ensued regarding All Terrain Vehicles (ATV) trails. The committee was informed that the Maitland ATV Club is working well with the County and that patrols are going well. There is a public meeting scheduled on June 23, 2008 at 7 p.m. at the Stanley Complex regarding the Municipality of Bluewater ATV By-law. Councillor B. Dowson requested that the Chair, Councillor B. Dykstra, Warden J. Bezaire and Mike Alcock, from the County's Public Works Department attend the public meeting.

- b) Detour for Culvert Replacement on County Road No. 2 (Appendix G)
Compensation Agreement with Municipality of Bluewater

The County compensation would consist of a new guiderail system for a local culvert, centre line painting and road sign improvements.

Council resolution would allow the Dedication Signs to be created and installed in coordination with Ministry of Transportation (MTO) guidelines and the MTO would provide ultimate direction regarding sign wording, sign size and sign placement. The dedication proposed is “Veterans Bluewater Highway”.
