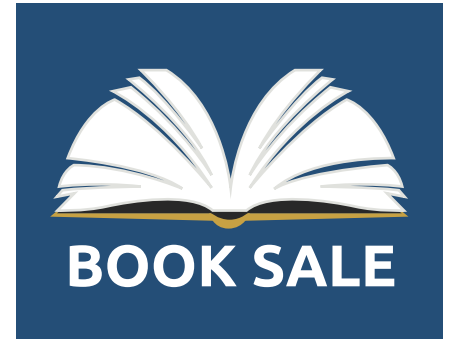

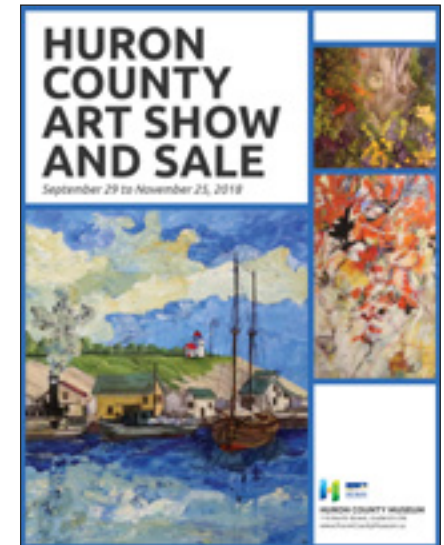

The Huron County Library provides public library services to all residents of the County of Huron through twelve branch libraries located in towns and villages across the County.

Meetings are usually held the second Wednesday of the month in the morning. Candidates must be at least 18 years old, Canadian citizens, and residents of Huron County.
