Office Closure

Huron County Economic Development offices located at 54 West Street in Goderich will be closed to the public effective end of day March 16, 2020 until further notice. Wherever possible services will be delivered remotely. All face to face meetings will be undertaken using video-conferencing solutions or via telephone.

Business Services

Small business services and programs are in full operation, with the exception that all meetings will take place remotely. Provincial programs administered through the department, including the Summer Company program and Starter Company Plus grant program, are proceeding as usual, with the exception that training and meetings will be delivered remotely using video conferencing solutions.
