Huron Clean Water Project Project Requirements

Forest Management Plans and Woodland Enhancement

Cost-share Rate: Up to 50%

Maximum Payment: \$1,000 (Forest Management Plans); \$3,000 (Woodland Enhancement)

Purpose:

- 1. To assist and educate landowners with proper forest management planning to optimize forest health and long term, sustainable returns from their woodlands
- 2. To establish a self-sustaining forest cover that will prevent soil erosion and benefit surface and groundwater quality

Eligibility:

- 1. Projects must demonstrate a water quality benefit.
- 2. Woodlots (0.2 to 1 ha.) must qualify for long term protection by the Huron County Forest Conservation Bylaw. All wooded areas in Huron County of 0.2 ha or larger are currently protected depending on density of tree cover and tree species.

Eligible Projects:

- 1. A forest management plan and/or silvicultural prescription created under direction of a professional forester (Member or Associate Member in good standing of the Ontario Professional Foresters Association and working directly for the landowner).
- 2. Tree marking according to the approved forest management plan, which must be carried out by a forester (OPFA Member/Associate) or Ontario Certified Tree Marker.
- 3. Control of invasive species under direction of an approved forest management plan (e.g., European Buckthorn, Garlic Mustard). Invasive species control must be done in accordance with the Best Management Practice for the applicable species.

The Clean Water Project encourages new projects. Projects will be considered by the Review Committee if the invoice is not older than 6 months at the time first contact with staff.

Project Details:

- 1. A site plan containing the following information must be submitted to CA staff for review: the size and a brief description of the history of the woodlot or woodland.
- 2. A project containing both a Forest Management Plan component, as well as Woodland Enhancement work will be treated as one project and is not eligible for both tiers of the grant within the category.
- 3. The Forest Management Plan & Woodland Enhancement category may be combined with the Fragile Land Retirement category, when tree planting is a component of the project, and the requirements of both categories are met.

Eligible Costs:

- 1. Licenced contractor services and applicable fees.
- 2. Materials and labour (other than applicant's or applicant's dependant) associated with an approved project.

Ineligible Costs:

- 1. Forest management plan/silvicultural prescription or associated tree marking not approved by CA or County staff.
- 2. Properties enrolled in the Managed Forest Tax Incentive Program are not eligible.
- 3. Activities recommended in MFTIP plans may be eligible (e.g., removing invasive species).
- 4. The costs of tendering a woodlot harvest are not eligible.

Grant will not be paid on HST if the applicant is entitled to a HST rebate.
