The purpose of this application is to sever agricultural lands to create two farm lots (i.e. a farm split). The proposed severed parcel is 40.5 hectares (100 acres) in size, and contains a sow barn, residence, mobile home and shed. The proposed retained parcel is 137.5 hectares (340 acres) and contains a silo. The retained parcel is adjacent to Highway 21. It has four existing entrances onto Highway 21. The Ministry of Transportation has recommended that as a condition of approval three of the four existing entrances be decommissioned to their satisfaction. The applicants are in objection to the Ministry of Transportation's recommended condition. The department is recommending approval of the application with all conditions. The Township of Ashfield-Colborne-Wawanosh recommended approval with conditions except for condition #4 (Ministry of Transportation condition).

Concerns were received from the Ministry of Transportation on the issue of existing entrances onto Highway 21. Comments were thoroughly considered but the effect did not influence the decision of Council to approve the application. CARRIED

9.2. Plan of Subdivision (40T22007) 2822071 Ontario Ltd. (Owner) Baker Planning Group c/o Caroline Baker (Applicant) Concession 7, Part Lot 21, Part of Park Lot 28 & 29, Plan 243 & Part Lot 22, Concession 8 as RP 22R3956 Parts 1 & 2 (presented by Meghan Tydd-Hrynyk)

The Draft Plan of Subdivision application proposes a residential subdivision with 23 single detached residential dwelling lots, 1 block for quadruplex residential dwelling, a block for stormwater management, and new municipal streets. The subject lands are approximately 8.09 hectares (20 acres). Access to the property will be from Patrick Street/Fordwich Line. There is a concurrent Official Plan Amendment Application (OPA18-2022) to designate lands being approximately 2.87 hectares (7 acres) east of East Street from 'Agriculture' to 'Settlement Area'. There is also a Zoning By-law Amendment application (HOW Z10-2022) to rezone the subject lands from D - Urban (Development) and AG1 (General Agricultural) to VR1-Special (Village Residential – Low Density - Special) and VR2 (Village Residential – Medium Density). The NE2 (Natural Environment – Limited Protection) is not proposed to change. The application is consistent with the Provincial Policy Statement, conforms to the Huron County and Howick Official Plans and is recommended for draft plan approval with conditions by Howick Council and the Planning Department.
