Huron County's annual budget is a financial plan for creating and maintaining programs and services for our residents. The planning process follows an annual cycle involving specific activities for Council, County staff, and the public.



The public has the opportunity to review the municipal budget process, receive information on the provisional budget, and engage on the County's virtual platform.



January-February

Council discusses provisional budget and considerations from public engagement.
Necessary revisions are made.

October-November

September-October

County departments prepare

and update their budgets for

the coming year.

County senior management and the financial planning team review submissions and examine the overall budget.

December

Council receives and reviews the provisional budget.

Public Engagement Closes February

The public has had an opportunity to engage in the annual budget process and the County's virtual platform closes.

March-April

Council adopts the budget.


